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This Operations Directive is for internal use only and does not enhance an officer's civil or criminal liability in any way. It should not be construed as a creation of a higher standard of safety or care in an evidentiary sense, with respect to third party claims. Violations of this Operations Directive, if proven, may only form the basis for a complaint by this Department, and only in a non-judicial administrative setting.

SECTION 1 PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy is to require the annual compilation and review of data related to all use of force incidents.

SECTION 2 POLICY

It is the policy of the Department that all use of force incidents will be tracked in the appropriate database as described in Directive 2.04.1.

SECTION 3 PROCEDURES

A. All use of force incidents will be tracked in the appropriate database as described in Directive 2.04.1 (J) (2) (3). The data will be reviewed annually to determine trends, training needs, equipment needs, and potential policy deficiencies. The annual report shall be completed by February 28th of the following year. The report will not include the use of Command Presence or Soft Hand Tactics.

B. RESPONSIBILITY

1. All members of the Department shall know and comply with all aspects of this directive.
2. All Division Commanders and supervisory personnel are responsible for ensuring compliance with the provisions and intent of this directive.
